

We actively participate in regular meetings of:

National Motorcyclists Council (NMC): the NMC is a coalition of motorcycling organisations, of which the BMF is a founding member, representing motorcyclists and working to influence government policy.

Federation of European Motorcyclists' Associations (FEMA): The BMF is also a founding member of FEMA, which represents European motorcyclists.

Several road safety bodies, including:

Parliamentary Advisory Council for Transport Safety (PACTS): promotes safe transport for all and their working groups provide an insight into research on different areas of road safety. We are involved in their working groups:

Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents (RoSPA) campaigns to reduce accidents, including through the National Road Safety Committee.

Other Organisations:

Motorcycle Strategy Group: managed by the Driver and Vehicle Standards Agency and the Department for Transport, aims to look at motorcycling in the context of wider policy.

Transport Focus: sponsored by the Department for Transport and represents all transport users. We are part of their Road User Panel.
